So What is Team Science anyway?

The theme for the 8th Annual IACRN Conference is 'Clinical Research Nursing: Embodying Team Science for Participant-Focused Care'. So what is Team Science anyway?

Team Science is an approach that brings together groups of individuals to address complex scientificconcepts ¹. The thought process behind team science is that if you combine specialized expertise, theoretical approaches and research methods you can produce higher impact science ¹.

The Science of Team Science (SciTS) is a type of research that looks at what processes help or hinder collaborative research¹ Bomer et al proposes using a multi-level mixed methods framework using macro, meso and micro level research. Macro level looks at organization change and cultural norms. Meso level examines group dynamics and teamwork. Micro level looks at individual training acquisition, communication and conflict resolution¹.

The National Cancer Institute developed a Team Science toolkit with resources for facilitating team science (www.teamsciencetoolkit.cancer.gov)2. Resources include tools to facilitate and evaluate team science, a self-assessment tool for facilitating team processes, and publications using team science.

Our keynote speaker <u>Steven Fiore</u>, <u>PhD</u> will be discussing the concept of team science and team dynamics at our

conference in October. We hope you will have the opportunity to join us as we move forward in our quest to enhance the specialty practice of Clinical Research Nursing.
