I want thank everyone who was able to attend yesterday's meeting for coming out and participating. If you were unable to make it, we missed you and understand, but still hope you will contribute in whatever way you can in the future. If there are other nurses you know who are engaged in research however known please share our efforts.

The overwhelming consensus was – yes, this is worthy of our attention and we should cultivate formal engagement with IACRN via establishing a local chapter here at UF representing the state of Florida.

Aligned with the IACRN vision of *“Enhancing clinical research quality and safety through specialized nursing practice”* as a local chapter, we will ground our efforts in:

1. **Promoting Clinical Research Nursing as a Specialty Practice** across All Practice Levels and Research Settings
2. **Disseminate “Scope and Standards of Practice for Clinical Research Nursing.”**
3. Support the establishment of an evidence base for practice through research and publication opportunities.
4. **Identify path to and process of certification.**
5. Heighten awareness of the specialty practice with research volunteers and the public.
6. Collaborate with the CTSI to Support the Professional Development of Clinical Research Nurses
7. Provide local, national and international continuing education opportunities for CRNs.
8. Develop and disseminate a standardized clinical research nursing training curriculum to support core competencies.
9. Create mentorship opportunities for professional development and future organizational leadership.
10. Engage with UF nursing school to heighten awareness and inclusion of the CRN role competencies in nursing education.

2. To participate in a local chapter you need to be a member of IACRN (<http://iacrn.memberlodge.org/join>)
 - a. There was discussion about asking for departmental support for this and Teresa had some suggestions on facilitating
 - b. There is an [ACRP Tool Kit](#), which can be adapted to request support. This could be a shared activity to template.
3. Draft the purpose of statement that highlights:
 - a. Objectives
 - b. Plan to get started
 - c. Strategy to get more CRN registered with IACRN and become also members of your chapter
 - d. Develop business plan as to how the group plan to run the chapter (optional)
 - e. Plan for educational activities and any other activities pertinent to improve the practice of clinical research nursing and benefits clinical research nurses.
4. Fill out the application that you will find in the chapter guide
 - a. Send it to CGC to be reviewed before submitting it to the board.

Membership and Dues:

1. IACRN (parent association) annual active membership due currently \$100.00
2. University of Florida Chapter of IACRN – annual active membership dues \$25.00
3. University of Florida Chapter of IACRN - members must also be a member of the IACRN parent organization. The University of Florida chapter treasurer will check the parent association membership at the time they join the University of Florida Chapter and at the time of their yearly renewal with the University of Florida Chapter.
4. Potential University of Florida Chapter members may attend two meetings without paying dues to the IACRN parent association or the Boston Chapter. However, after potential members attend two meetings, they will be asked to make a decision on joining. Guest who are present at meetings will not have voting privileges unless they are an active member of both the IACRN parent association and the University of Florida Chapter of IACRN.
