# IACRN is proud to announce the Keynote Speaker for our 8th Annual Conference:

Stephen M. Fiore, PhD

Dr. Stephen M. Fiore is Director, Cognitive Sciences Laboratory, and faculty with the University of Central Florida's Cognitive Sciences Program in the Department of Philosophy and Institute for Simulation & Training. He earned his Ph.D. in Cognitive Psychology from the University of Pittsburgh, Learning Research and Development Center. Dr. Fiore is President of the Interdisciplinary Network for Group Research and a founding Program Committee member for the annual Science of Team Science Conference. He maintains a multidisciplinary research interest that incorporates aspects of the cognitive, social, organizational, and computational sciences in the investigation of learning and performance in individuals and teams. His primary area of research is the interdisciplinary study of complex collaborative cognition and the understanding of how humans interact socially and with

technology. Dr. Fiore has been a visiting scholar for the study of shared and extended cognition at École Normale Supérieure deLyon in Lyon, France (2010) and he was a member of the expert panel for the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development's 2015 Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA) which focused on collaborative problem solving skills. He has contributed to working groups for the National Academies of Science in understanding and measuring "21st Century Skills" and was a committee member of their "Science of Team Science" consensus study. As Principal Investigator and Co-Principal Investigator he has helped to secure and manage approximately \$20 million in research funding. He is co-author of a book on "Accelerating Expertise" (2013) and is a co-editor of volumes on Shared Cognition (2012), Macrocognition in Teams (2008), Distributed Training (2007), and Team Cognition (2004). Dr. Fiore has also co-authored approximately 200 scholarly publications in the area of learning, memory, and problem solving at the individual and the group level.
